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This document is an attempt to capture whatever we can of the lives of Joseph and Cecilia Diamond and their descendants. We know very little about the couple who emigrated to the United States either late in the 19th or early in the 20th century and left a large family to prosper. In attempting to document their story unfortunately all of those who actually knew these two are gone and there are very few remaining facts.

What we do know is perhaps best presented in the photo below which shows the couple and their 10 children. The picture was likely taken in 1910, the year my mother Ruth was born, as you can see her in Celia's lap.

Joseph was born in 1871 and Celia in 1870. According to Samuel Israel, (Sarah Diamond's grandson) Celia's maiden name was Krawish (Steven Diamond believes her maiden name was Mopsik, so there is some confusion here. There is a Mopsik family web site and Steve Diamond had correspondence with a Mopsik descendent Donald (a musician) in San Antonio, TX.) According to some records, Joseph had brown hair and was 5 feet, 2 inches in height and he was a tailor. Celia had black hair and was 4 feet, 10 inches in height.



This picture was taken in 1930 at 865 Park Avenue in Brooklyn, N.Y. Joseph Diamond owned this tenement building. See the Appendix for precise descriptions of whom is in the photo. Here is a description of who is in the photo provided by David Diamond to his son Steven,

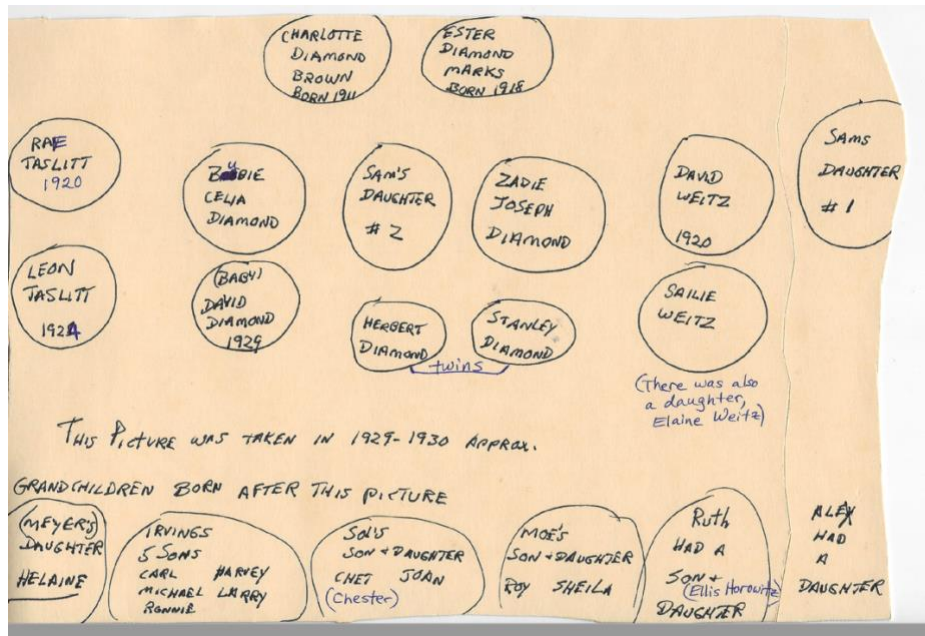
“Yes, Uncle Alex Diamond is kneeling on the left. Uncle Irving is holding me. The man standing next to zadye is Rabbi Shisgal, our cousin. The two children near me are Lee and Rae Taslitt. Sarah Weitz is in the lower right hand corner, Sam Weitz is next to Lee Taslitt. The twin boys, front center, are Herb and Stan Diamond, sons of Meyer and Kate. Meyer and Kate Diamond are standing behind Grandma Fanny; and Meyer is standing to the left of Grandma shaded by the tree. To the right of Kate is Sol Diamond. In front of Sol is his wife Theresa. In front of Theresa is Celia Diamond, my grandmother. Now moving to the right of Celia Diamond is Rabbi Shisgal. To the right of Rabbi Shisgal is Joseph Diamond, my grandfather. Next to the right is Ray Shernow, next is Mollie Taslitt and my aunt Lilly Reine....

Behind Uncle Alex is Uncle Moe Diamond. To the right of Uncle Alex is Moe's wife Ann Diamond. To the right of Ann Diamond is Charlotte Diamond (my sister) and Ruth Diamond (the mother of Ellis Horowitz)....”

“Oh yes, I almost forgot Davie Weitz is sitting in front of Charlotte Diamond.

Below are a few late-in-life photos that we have of Joseph and Cecilia Diamond. We believe that they were both from Minsk, Belarus. What we do know is that sometime in the 1930s they decided to leave their entire family and move to Palestine. Celia died of cancer soon after arriving, 2 days after Yom Kippur on Wednesday, October 9, 1935, (she was 65), and is buried on the Mount of Olives, in the old city of Jerusalem. Joseph died 6 days before Passover on Friday, April 1, 1955 and is buried in the new city of Jerusalem

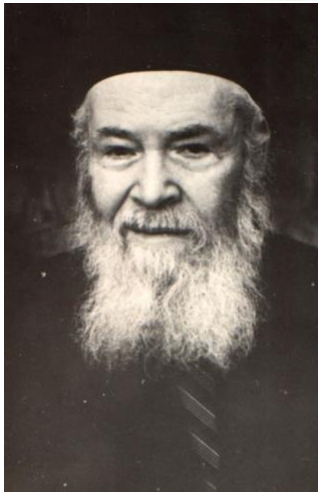

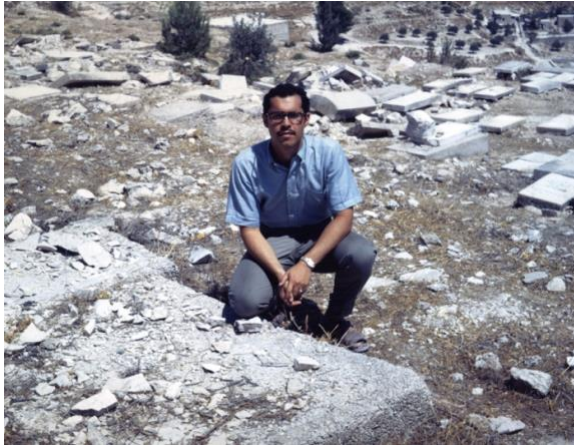

The Matriarch, Celia Diamond

Celia and Joseph

At the far right is the last known photo of Joseph Diamond who died at age 84. The picture of Joseph (actual name was Yechiel Yosef) and Celia standing together was taken the day Joseph was to leave Celia and family and get on a ship to Palestine. Apparently it was common practice to want to die in Jerusalem and Celia had cancer and needed one or more surgeries before she could depart. She followed her husband to Palestine in 1933. Joseph was connected to Kolel America, see <http://israelvisit.co.il/kolel-am/kolel-am.htm>. Established in 1895 its purpose was to encourage and assist Jews from North America to move to Jerusalem.

Celia's mother's name was Rose Rachel and her husband was Samuel. Samuel died young and Rose emigrated to Palestine. Celia Diamond was buried on the Mount of Olives which unfortunately was taken by Jordan when Israel declared its independence as a country in 1948. The graves were desecrated as is seen in the first photo below. The photo was taken in 1967, soon after the area was liberated by the Israelis. The person kneeling next to the grave is me, Ellis (Diamond) Horowitz who was visiting Israel and was able to locate the grave. The second photo shows the repaired grave, which was paid for by some of the Diamond family.



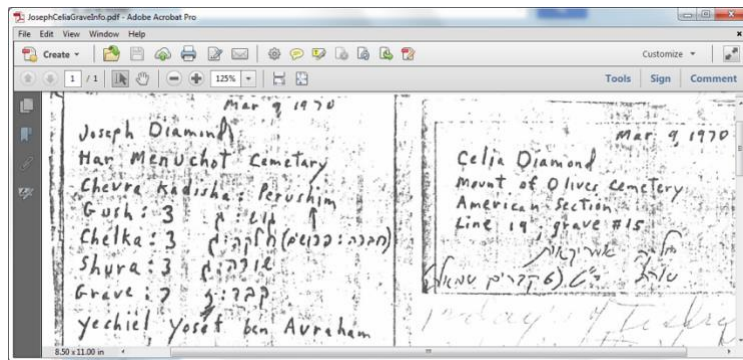

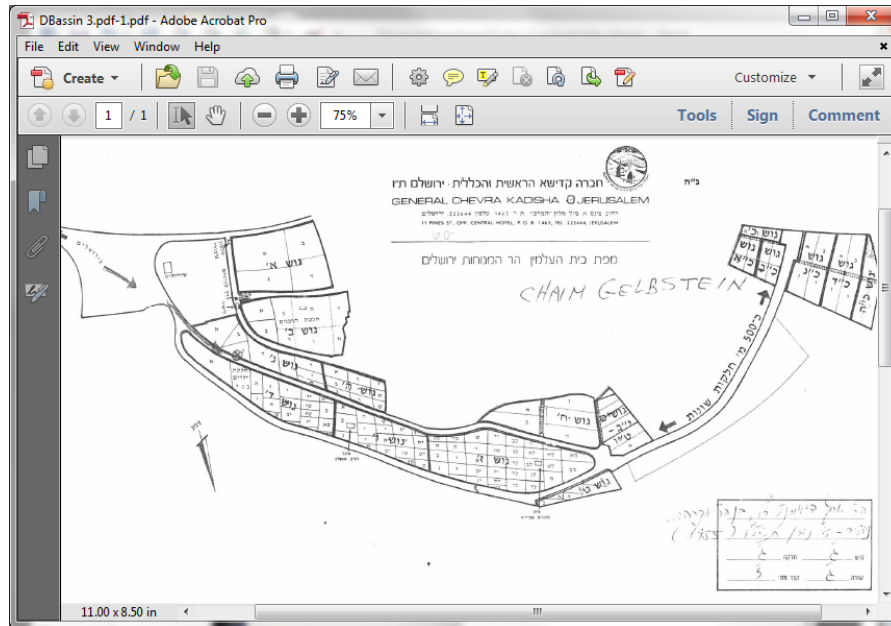

Apparently the above picture is of Diamond ancestors in front of their home in Minsk(?), but no date and no names are attached. Can anyone provide any information?

The following pages contain very brief summaries of Joseph and Celia's descendants. As there were so many immediate children, the descendants have greatly expanded. My focus has been on our ancestors. Any descendant is welcome to pick up where I have left off and continue both up and down the genealogy tree.

Recent postscript (Nov. 2015). Dawn Yonah, granddaughter of Molly Taslitt, daughter of Leon Taslitt, who now lives in Israel sent me this recent email:

"I am very excited to report that even though she was not a blood relative, I've found (by Divine guidance) the gravesite of our step great-grandmother!! Heretofore, we knew nothing about Great-Grandpa Joseph's second wife. As I had thought, her grave is in fact near his; I just had never seen it before.

Her stone was not easy to decipher, but I used my extensive Intelligence background to cull the following:

- Her name was Rachel Leah daughter of Yitzhak (I guess she was Jewish!)
- Her last name is spelled differently than Joseph's on the stone: "Diamant" instead of "Diamond" That's what you get when you try to spell an English name (Diamond) in Hebrew!
- She died eight years after Great-Grandpa, on 29 April 1963
- Just so we wouldn't have to question if she was in fact a Diamond, information on the stone confirms she was the widow of Yechiel Yosef (Joseph)! Eureka.



1. Harry Diamond

Born June 17, 1892, deceased August 26, 1963 at the age of 71. Cause of death was pneumonia secondary to diabetes. Harry was named Abraham Harry (Avram Hirsch) at birth. As a middle-aged man he changed the order of his birth name. Harry was born at home, as Celia was assisted by a mid wife, Mrs. L. Roseworthy. At the time of Harry's birth his parents lived at 44 Forsyth Street in New York City, and his father Joseph was a 21 year old tailor and cap maker on the lower east side of Manhattan.

As a teen-ager Harry was told by his father that his mother had given birth to a child back in the old country, but the child died as an infant.

By the time Harry was thirteen years old he had six younger siblings. Once Harry achieved Bar-Mitzvah he was told by his father that he was a man now, and therefore it was his responsibility to leave school and go to work to help his father support their large and growing family. Harry obeyed his father, but very reluctantly. A short time after Harry was forced to leave school to help support the family, Harry decided he wanted to be independent and be able to do what he wanted with the money he earned. Accompanied by three or four older boys Harry jumped a train headed west. The boys eventually arrived in Chicago, Illinois where the older boys took off and left Harry all alone. Scared and in a strange city Harry soon found his way to a Jewish orphanage in Chicago. Meanwhile back in New York, Celia was naturally upset that her son had run away and she was very worried that Harry being so young would not be able to take care of himself. At the supper table one evening as Celia was crying over her missing son, Joseph attempted to calm his wife by saying, "When the boy gets hungry enough, he'll be back, you will see!" Meanwhile in Chicago, 14 year old Harry hired himself out to a Jewish farmer and worked hard as a farm hand tending livestock and crops for a full year. Slightly over a year after Harry had left home, one afternoon there was a knock on the door of the Diamond family apartment. When the door was opened in walked a proud 15 year old Harry Diamond; carrying a suitcase, and wearing a brand new suit and tie.

Occupation: Vegetable and fruit salesperson, automobile salesman

The photo on the left was taken in 1934, Harry was 42 years old. Seated is Frances (maiden name Bassin). They had 3 children, two girls and a boy. To Frances' right is David and David's two sisters flank Harry, on the left is Esther and on the right is Charlotte. The second photo is Lena Bassin (1850 – 1939). Lena (Mofsik) Bassin was Celia's oldest sister, and the mother of Harry's wife Fanny. Harry and Fanny were 1st cousins.

1. Esther above at age 16, (Essie born 1918, died 2011) at age 93, and on Harry's right is
2. Charlotte at age 21 (born 1912, died 2007) at age 95. Charlotte Albert Brown and had 2 children: Harry and Fanny had two children, both of whom died at a young age
 1. Lester (born and died at age 1 year in 1914),
 2. Rose (born 1915 and died at age 1 year 1916)

Lester was buried in New York City area and Rose was buried at Anshe Dowig Cemetery West Roxbury, Ma.

From Steve Diamond

"Charlotte and Al Brown have two children. Their first born is Paul Brown who last I heard was a professor of Art at a university in or around New York City. Paul must be close to retirement by this time. Paul has one son Scott, I attended Scotty's bar-mitzvah in 1980. Charlotte and Al Brown's second child is Beverly Brown. Beverly didn't marry or have children, but I know she had a long-term partner. Although Charlotte and my father communicated we really never had any interaction with Paul (Paul would not do a bar-mitzvah for Scotty, so Charlotte and Al did it and it was just my father and I, Charlotte and Al, Al's mother, grandma Fanny that attended). Beverly came to my bar-mitzvah and I saw her from time to time because she lived in Framingham near my parents, but have not seen her since Charlotte passed."

3. David Diamond born February 12, 1929, deceased April 14, 2009. David married Geraldine Freeman on June 21, 1953. David and Geri had three sons:
 - a. **Steven**, born June 10, 1955, living in Pittsfield, MA. Steve married Holly Kennedy on June 10, 1978, divorced December 2001. Steve and Holly had seven children; Joseph, Abraham, Rebekah, Charissa, Jerusha, Sarah, and Samuel.

2. Samuel Diamond

Born April 10, 1894 and deceased March 13, 1921. Sam was murdered while serving as a chief petty officer in U.S. Navy at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. He was married to Rose Leah Epstein and had two daughters: Florence born March 25, 1918, and Charlotte was born August 18, 1920. Florence had 3 children:

- 1) Philip, born, married, living in Maine, had one daughter
- 2) Saul, born, married, living in Florida, had two children
- 3) Joshua, born, Joshua married Melanie ? on ?, living in San Diego, CA. Joshua and Melanie had X children.

Charlotte had two daughters named Sheila and Lois.

The portrait below is of Sam taken in 1918 when he attained rank of Chief Petty Officer. The original was hung proudly in Harry and Fanny's parlor until Harry's death in 1963.



Steve Diamond has done some amazing research on Samuel. According to Steve “The grave is located at the Baron Hirsch Cemetery on Richmond Avenue in Staten Island, NY. The grave is in the Neiberg Society lot. Though the Neiberg lot contains about 146 graves, only about 25 remain visible. The remainder are covered over with trees, thorn bushes, wild vines and poison ivy.”

In a subsequent letter Steve recounts the death of Samuel Diamond

“Samuel Jacob Diamond was Chief Printer on the U.S.S. Columbia. Around 9:15 pm Saturday March 12, 1921 Sam was attacked as he slept on his cot in the print shop of the U.S.S. Columbia. The attack was carried out by fellow sailor R.P. Gill, Printer First Class. Sam was the senior and in charge of the print shop. It was common knowledge on the Columbia that Gill held a deep animosity toward Sam.

Testimony gained from a Board of Inquest held Sunday March 13th and a four day Court of Inquiry held later in March, concluded that Raymond Parkinson Gill crept into the print shop the night of March 12, carrying the large port wrench that was kept near the print shop. As Sam slept laying on his right side Gill struck Sam multiple times on the left side of his head. According to testimony about 15 minutes after the attack R.P. Gill climbed up to the main deck of the ship shouting, “Is the Executive Officer present?” When Gill was questioned, he replied, “I want to be locked up.” When asked what for, Gill replied, “I cannot tell you.” At the same time that R.P. Gill was being questioned by a Lieutenant Commander, the Columbia’s Chief Electrician was walking past the print shop when he heard a loud peculiar snoring sound. The Chief electrician looked through the partition into the print shop and saw Sam lying unconscious on his cot with his face and head covered with blood. Immediately the Chief Electrician began yelling to the Officer-of-the-deck for a doctor, saying, “Something has happened to Diamond the Chief Printer.”

Upon hearing the commotion and realizing something had happened to Sam Diamond, the Lieutenant Commander put Gill into the custody of the Master-at-Arms, and ran down to the print shop. Upon arrival at the print shop Sam was found lying on his cot in an unconscious condition bleeding profusely from his head, left ear, his nose and mouth. Exposed brain tissue was wiped away revealing a large penetrating triangular wound behind Sam’s left ear. Sam was immediately transported to the medical ship the U.S.S. Relief. Once aboard the Relief the Lieutenant Commander stayed with the medical team as emergency surgery was performed.

The surgery revealed that branching off from the triangular wound behind Sam’s left ear was a three inch long laceration fracture which extended upward through the mastoid portion of the temporal lobe and onto the vertex of the skull above the left ear, with numerous smaller fractures radiating off the principle fracture. In addition there was found a large portion of bone about two or three inches in diameter had been driven down into the brain by the force of the blow. The depressed fragment of bone was lifted out revealing the dura, without pulsation. At this point the doctors realized that in spite of surgical interference death would occur in a few hours. The doctors closed the wound in the best possible way, applied a loose bandage, and Sam was taken to a quiet room. Death came seven hours later at 5:25 am Sunday March 13, 1921. The cause of death was intra-cranial injury due to a compound comminuted fracture of the skull involving the left temporal and parietal regions of the skull.

Within hours of Sam’s death The Commander Train of the Atlantic Fleet ordered a Board of Inquest to take place that Sunday afternoon to gather the immediate facts surrounding Sam’s death. That same day The Commander Train of the Atlantic Fleet ordered a full four day long Court of Inquiry for the purpose of gathering all the facts involving the death of Sam Diamond, Chief Printer, U.S.S. Columbia. The facts compiled by the Board of Inquest and the Court of Inquiry were sent to the United States Department of Justice as evidence to be used by the Department of Justice in connection with the trial of Raymond P. Gill by Federal Civil authorities at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. For the tie period immediately following the murder until being turned over to the federal authorities in Philadelphia Gill was

kept prisoner aboard the U.S.S. Columbia. Per order of the Commander Train of the Atlantic Fleet both the U.S.S. Columbia and the U.S.S. Relief were ordered to set sail for Philadelphia, in order to arrive at the Philadelphia Navy Yard for May 1st for a stay of six weeks, during which time R.P. Gill would stand trial for murder.

R.P. Gill was brought to trial at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on June 13 and 14, 1921. After two days of testimony, the following verdict was given.

“Guilty of murder in the second degree recommending him to the mercy of the Court.”

On June 21, 1921, R.P. Gill received his sentencing.

“...it is considered and adjudged that the defendant Raymond P. Gill be imprisoned and confined in the U.S. Penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga., for the term of twelve years from June 27, 1921, and stand committed until judgment be fully complied with.”

To the best of our knowledge the only family member present during the federal trial in Philadelphia was Sam’s wife Rose L. (Epstein) Diamond. Paperwork from this trial, “The United States of America vs Raymond P. Gill” seems to indicate that Sam’s wife Rose was called up as a witness during the trial. Once the trial had ended Sam’s body was turned over to his older brother Harry Abraham Diamond, my paternal grandfather. Years later Harry told my father that by the time he viewed the body Sam’s face was almost unrecognizable. After identifying the body on behalf of the family, Harry had the body transported to New York City for burial. In the presence of family and friends Sam was interred at the Baron Hirsch Cemetery Staten Island, NY on March 23, 1921.“

They lived in Mt. Holyoke, Massachusetts. Marjorie died in 1999 and Leon moved to Florida where he married Helen Barksy. 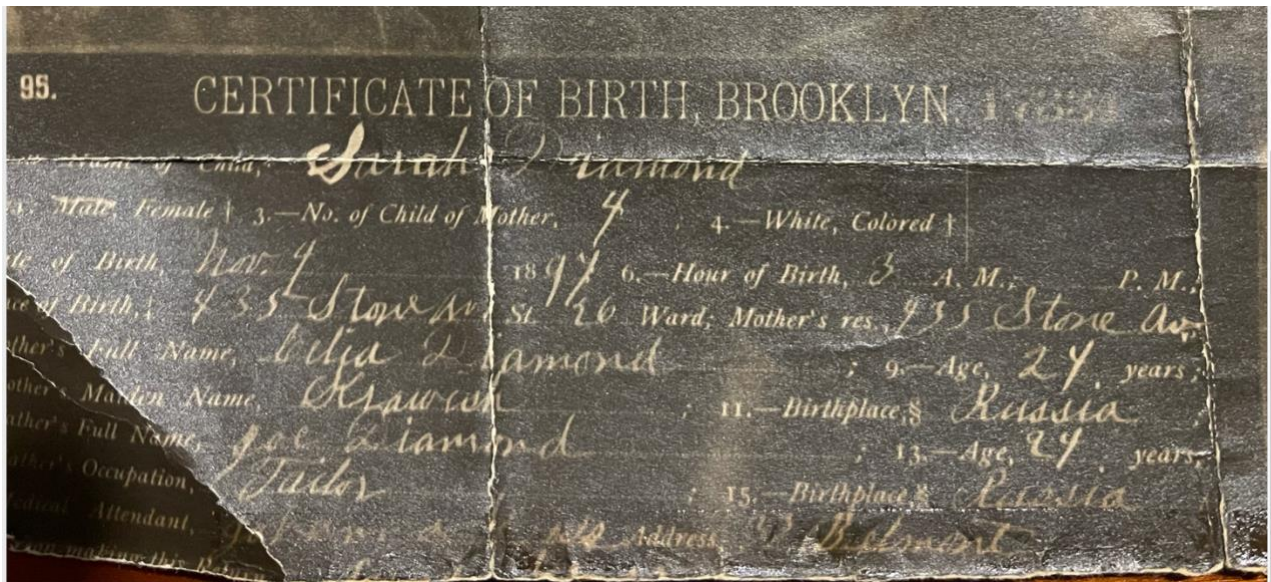

Born: November 4, 1897, the birth certificate below, supplied by Elaine and Samuel Israel shows Celia Diamond's maiden name as Krawish. As for Sarah's birth year, I read it as 1897, see my appendix at the back of this document.



Sarah died in 1972 of colon cancer. Married twice, Sarah and her first husband adopted Davey (born in 1920, died in 2006). Sarah's second husband was Jack Weitz and they had two children, Solomon (nicknamed Sailey) and Elaine.

6. Meyer (nickname Mac)

In the previous picture one can see the twin boys, front center, named Herb and Stan Diamond, who are the sons of Meyer and Kate.

The following document was contributed by Kathy Diamond, the wife of Steven Diamond who is a grandson of Meyer Diamond.

Meyer Diamond Born February 2, 1902, Brooklyn, NY. Meyer is listed, along with his parents, in the 1920 Census in Manhattan. His brother, Harry, was living in Boston by 1920, so I assume Meyer moved there to work with Harry – both men were in the fruit business. In 1925, Meyer married Kate Magazine (b. January 1, 1898, Boston, MA). On October 9, 1926, Meyer and Kate had identical twin sons, Stanley Jack and Herbert Allan. A daughter Helene followed on May 18, 1932.

Stanley married Ruth Davis (b. March 13, 1947) on December 2, 1946. They met in Boston when Ruth was 15 – her dad, Louis, moved the family there from Brooklyn for work. They moved back to Brooklyn after a year, so Stan and Ruth had a long-distance relationship. Stan served in the Navy during WWII.

Stan and Ruth had three children: David Paul, born June 17, 1948, Marcia Gayle, born April 2, 1953, and Steven Elliot, born June 14, 1958. The family lived in Brooklyn and moved to Hicksville, NY (on Long Island) around 1956.

David and his partner, Gail Roseman (they were married and divorced and then got back together), currently live in Sarasota, FL. They do not have children. David and Gail went to high school together, lost touch, and then got back together around 1980.

Marcia married Howard Sandler, who is originally from Maryland, on September 2, 1979. They lived in Maryland for several years after they were married and then moved to Woodbury, NY on Long Island around 1986. They have two sons: Adam Lawrence (b. November 24, 1983), an attorney who lives in Randolph, New Jersey with his wife, Randi (nee Chonowski), and their two children, Marley (7) and Spencer (4), and Matthew Brett (b. October 17, 1987), a CPA who recently became engaged to Christina.

Steven married Kathy Ostrow, who grew up in Forest Hills, NY, on October 19, 1980. They have two children: a daughter, Alexandra Morgan (b. January 18, 1994), who is currently the assistant to the comedian/TV star Hasan Minhaj, and a son, Dylan Hunter (b. August 11, 1999), currently a senior at Cornell University, who plans to attend law school. The family lives in Huntington, (LI) NY.

Stan's brother, Herbie, also served in the Navy during WWII. In March 1950, Herbie married Joyce Marcia Margil (b. July 6, 1929). They had three children: Mona (b. 1954), who I believe lives in Washington State, Joanne (b. 1957), and Paul (b. 1962), who I believe lives in New Hampshire (I haven't finished my deep dive into their current status).

For many years, Herbie was estranged from both Stan and Helene (the result of some sort of family argument). Stan and Herbie reconnected at Kate Diamond's funeral in 1985, but I don't believe Helene and Herbie ever did.

Helene Diamond married Sydney Martin Covall (b. February 11, 1932) They had three children: Mark (b. 1954), who married Kathy Heinbuch (b. 1950), David (b. 1957), who married Stephanie Bernstein, and Lisa (b. 1963), who married Michael Rovinsky. Mark and Kathy have a son, Harrison (b. 1988) who is married to Sara Wassel. Harrison is an attorney, and they have two young children and reside in Connecticut. David and Stephanie live in Atlanta, Ga and have two daughters, Karly (b. 1993) and Julie (b. 1997). Lisa also lives in Atlanta and is married to Michael Rovinsky; they have one son, Andrew, who is a senior in high school.

Born April 1, 1908, he was a smoker for 30 years, then gave it up for 30 years, but it eventually caught up to him. He had a lung removed, but still died of lung cancer on September 12, 1983 at the age of 75 of a combination of lung cancer and emphysema. Sol's wife Theresa was born on November 9, 1903, and died on September 6, 1990 at age 87. She suffered a heart attack from which she never recovered. Sol and Theresa were married on April 26, 1929 in Dayton, Ohio. They have two children: Joan and Chester. Joan was born on March 10, 1931 and was recently living in Florida. Chester was born on June 27, 1936, he was named after Celia. Rabbi Shisgal shown in the earlier photo played an important early role in Chester's life, giving him his Hebrew name Tzuriel ("God is my rock"). This is a remembrance from Sol's son Chester:

"Sol only had a 3rd grade education and was out working at a very young age. However, he was quite articulate and people often thought he was a lawyer. He was quite intelligent and knowledgeable especially about politics. He worked as a shoe window trimmer and was quite skilled in that job working with materials, backdrops and excelled in the actual placement of shoes. He worked for the National Shoe Company and also worked freelance. His days were very long. He started early and arrived home late. When I was young he often took me along with him and I could see how quickly, efficiently, and expertly he worked. Individual store owners felt fortunate to have Sol dress their windows. When I was nine years old we moved to Boston so he could work in Uncle Mac's produce market, but we stayed for only a year and then returned to Brooklyn. But it was in Boston that I got to know Aunt Sophie and Uncle Irving and their 5 boys, Aunt Fannie and Uncle Harry, and Davey and Essie. I also remember Al Brown. Sophie and Irving lived on the same street as we did, Glenarm St. in Dorchester. I remember it was near Franklin Park and the Oriental movie theater. If I remember correctly Fannie and Harry lived on Blue Hill Ave.

When we moved back to Brooklyn we lived at 813 Crown St. and stayed there from 5th grade at P.S. 189, Winthrop Jr. High, and Samuel J. Tilden H.S. I was born on Lincoln Place near Franklin Ave and we moved to 368 Eastern Parkway where my Mom's parents Fannie and Simon Blumenson also lived (same apt building, but different apartments). It was five blocks from the famous Ebbets Field where the Brooklyn Dodgers played. Mom was born in Manchester, Eng. and when she was 3 yrs old they moved to Dayton, Ohio. After Mom and Dad were married in 1929 they moved to Brooklyn where dad's work was. My parents were not religious, but living in a Jewish neighborhood, Yiddishkeit was in the air! My parents never attended synagogue, even on the High Holy Days. They had no negative feelings about religion, it was simply not part of their life-style. At Passover time, for Seder we either went to mom's parents or sometimes to Aunt Sarah and Uncle Jack Weitz's. We also were at the Weitz's on Friday nights to watch wrestling and to play chess with Jack. On Sunday's we frequently visited Aunt Ann and Uncle Moe on Brighton 11th St. Sometimes we went to Far Rockaway to see my mom's Aunt Sis and Uncle Sam and their family. From time to time your parents would visit, also Aunt Molly from Tampa, and also Uncle Al was around quite a bit.

My Sister Joan is married with two children, Madelyn and Alison. They are both married -- Maddy has two children -- Sara and Alex, and Alison and her husband have a little girl Tara. Joan was a registered nurse but when she married

left nursing. Joan and her husband David recently moved from N.J. to Florida to be close to Alison and her family. Maddy stayed in Jersey with her husband and kids. When I have a chance I'll scan some pix for you.“

Sol and Teresa Diamond are standing on the far right in the picture below. Teresa's hands are resting on shoulders of Bea Gillar and her husband. To Sol's left is Samuel Adler (husband of Rose Leah Epstein Diamond). Rose was the widow of Samuel Jacob Diamond, not pictured in photo. Letter from Joseph Diamond, Jerusalem, dated 7 March 1946.
Translated from the Yiddish by Sylvia Taslitt Lustig;
transcribed by Dawn Taslitt Jones, January 2003.

To my beloved daughter, Malka,

I wish you happiness always. You are the only one who doesn't forget to make me happy with a letter. And I can write you that a long time has passed since I heard from anybody. And I didn't know any possible reason for the silence. And now G-d has blessed me and helped me that I received your beloved letter. I was very, very happy as a result.

When you write that you are healthy and that you visit Raizel (Rae) for a few days, and you gave a kiss to your beloved grandchild, this is my chiefest joy. (Be well.)

You asked me to tell you if I eat vegetables. I don't eat vegetables. Thank G-d, my stomach works well. I feel better than I used to feel (in the best of health).

I have written you a number of times that I received your package of the two pair of underwear. I must tell you it was most necessary and it proved very good. The shirt you sent also fit very well. And I ask you, dear Malka, when you write me a letter, please don't forget to address part of it to my wife. She's sensitive and she reads the letters and she throws it up to me that no regards are sent to her in the letters. Therefore, G-d will help you (for doing a mitzvah like that) with all that is good. You should have a lot of nachas from your beloved children as well as from me. And I send my regards to Israel, to my beloved Rae... (?) (*She should?*) live happily with (*her?*) husband and with (*her?*) beloved son. They should be well with many years. I should live to see his bar mitzvah. Live in happiness and good health. I also send regards to dear Lee. He should come home O.K. and get married soon and you should have nachas from him, too.

I see as you write me that you may go back to Florida and the warm climate. But it's too far away from Rae's. Kiss the beloved grandchild. The 15th of April is Pesach—Have a kosher and happy Pesach, and happy yontiv. Enjoy together with your children.

Joseph Diamond's Letter to Malka, 1946

Joseph's letter was written in 1946 to Malka, his name for his daughter Molly. In the letter he refers to Rae, who is Molly's daughter and the "beloved grandchild" is Rae's son Barry Batinkoff. The wife Joseph refers to was his 2nd wife, as Celia had been deceased over 10 years at this writing. At time of this letter Molly's son Lee was serving in U.S. Navy hence the reference to coming home soon. He did come home and got married as the next letter will bring up.

To my dear and devoted daughter, Malka,

I am happy to write to you that I now am in the best of health and I hope to hear the very same from all of you, dear Malka. I can now write to you that I received your beloved letter. I am also happy to hear that Sarah's children are doing good business and may the Eternal One help them. Dear Malka, write and tell me what Rae and her husband are doing with their beloved little son (what is Lee's charming little daughter doing ??) She should be with many years with good fortune. Dear Malka, you should have joy from all of your beloved children and figure me in on it, too.


I want to ask you in case you have a dress you don't want to use, send it to Moshe (?). Maybe he'll send it to my wife. Perhaps you could send some clothes. She hears that the other ones have children in America and the children send them clothes. And my wife doesn't receive anything. You must know that even the strange woman who works for me (?) you also can send a little dress. She's all alone (has nobody). I must say that after I'm gone you'll have to help her as much as you can. You'll have to help her make a life as much as you can afford to and if you'll visit Sarah in her house, you should read her this letter. I also want Sarah to know what I've written. And she should also inform all the children about this.

Be well, from your loving father, Joseph (Yosef) Diamond. Send my regards to Israel, Rae, with Lee, with his beloved wife and their little daughter. They should all be blessed with long life. My wife sends you very warm regards. Answer me for that is my entire pleasure.

(NOTE: Translator says Joseph spelled words as they sounded, not necessarily the correct spelling; also, he repeated himself a lot.)

Joseph Diamond's Letter to Malka, 1950

Joseph's letter above is again to Malka, written in 1950. The reference to Lee's charming little daughter is Dawn, Moshe would be Moe Diamond. Apparently every year Moe would take up a collection of clothing and money and send it to his father in Palestine. (Harry used to get very annoyed at Moe's insistence that Harry should be made to contribute. According to my father, Harry reluctantly would give in and send something). None of us know who the "strange woman" is a reference to.



Dear D & D - according to your request, I'll translate just the way it's written - - - My dear children Harry and Fanny, live happily always. I am in good health and hope to hear the same from you. I received the invitation to your dear son's wedding - they should live with mozek and happiness always. They should bring you much happiness. I would very much like to be at the wedding, but at my age, the trip would be too much for me. Please send me a picture of the couple, so I could see them personally. Stay healthy and live happily, from me your loving father Joseph Diamond. My wife sends regards.

Joseph's Translated Letter

This final letter has Joseph responding to an invitation to the wedding of David and ? in June of 1953. This letter is Joseph's response to Harry and Fanny. All Joseph's letters were written in Yiddish. In 1984 Davey

Weitz and my father went to Florida to visit Uncle Moe. While down there they asked Moe to translate into English the letter that Joseph had sent to Harry in 1953.

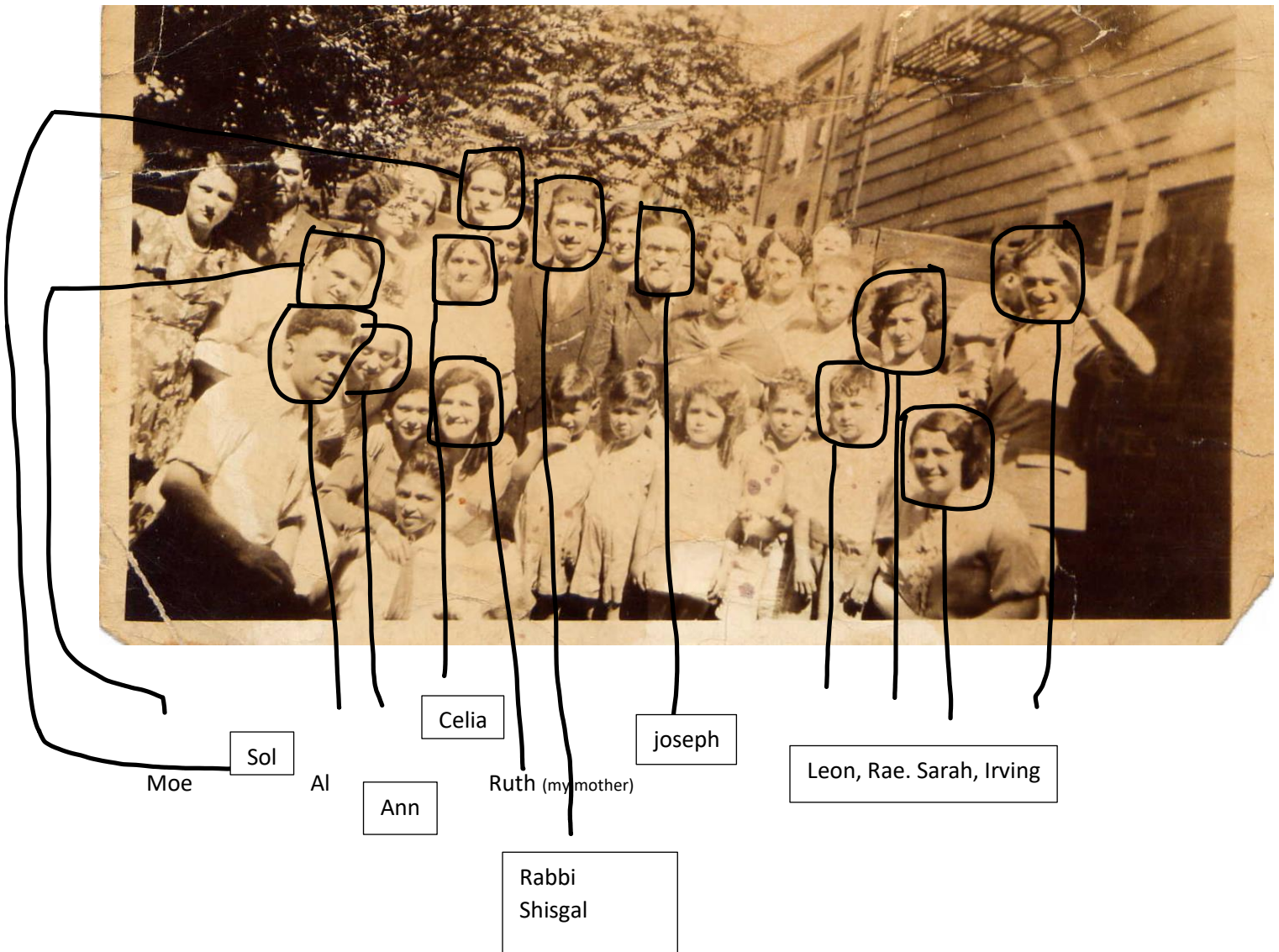

U. S. S. COLUMBIA

Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.
January 14, 1921

Dear Harry:-

I've been seriously thinking of being transferred to a Boston ship. By that I mean a ship that belongs in the Charleston Navy Yard. In fact I have already been promised one of them ships if I want one.

My idea of going to Boston is first to get out of New York. Second I was thinking of buying a house with you or some little farm. That is one thing I have got to do. If I don't buy one with you, then I expect I will buy one myself in Ohio or Jersey. Then again if I get up in Boston I ought to be able to drum you up some trade in the Navy Yard. You see if I go to Boston, then the government moves my furniture and family up free of charge. I am allowed 3000 lbs of furniture.

I hope you will let me know what you think of it

APPENDIX 5: LETTER FROM RUTH HOROWITZ TO IRVING HOROWITZ REGARDING THE BIRTH OF ELLIS HOROWITZ

February 14, 1944

Darling,

Here I am coming along slowly. Our little one is doing nicely dear. Every morning the nurse brings him to me. He has black hair and blue eyes, but then they keep changing, so I can't say who he looks like or will look like yet. He has a cute little nose and small ears. He weighed 7 lbs 4 oz. when he was born. I have a room all to myself honey, the number is 510. The address of the hospital is Stuyvesant Place & East 16th Street or E. 17th Street¹ as you've been writing is correct. I received both your wires.

Everybody honey has been very nice. Joe was still here when the baby was born. He came with Florence Saturday afternoon and brought me a beautiful mirrored box with a box of candy in it. Then my sister Sarah, Jack, Elaine and Al were here. They brought candy. Oh yes, Florence brought a box of nuts and candy. Then Sophies mother and sisters Julie and Sarah were here and brought me dates and Halavah. Oh honey, if you were here you'd have so many good things to eat. They all managed to get in and also to see the baby with Joe's help. The fact that he was in uniform they didn't refuse him a thing and so when he asked to see the baby they all went with him and saw the baby too and everyone was thrilled. Honey Florence and Joe have been wonderful. We have become very friendly and gonna stay that way. Oh yes, I must include Gloria here. She's been very sweet. On Friday when I got the real pains Sophie called her. She came right over. That day started out with a real snow and blizzard. She called the taxi phone, there wasn't even an answer. She went over to a policeman and told him why she needed a cab and he said I'll get you a cab or a police car, don't worry. He got us the cab and we got to the hospital safely and in time. They gave her my clothes to take home and she left her phone number to be called when the baby arrived. This was about 2:00PM and at 9:30pm our little one was here. The doctor called Gloria immediately and she passed on the news. On Sunday honey your mother came with Florence and brought some flowers. Sarah and Jack came again with a beautiful bouquet of flowers. Ann came along with more good things. Also Phil, Frieda and Sophie with more. I sure had two very exciting visiting days.

Now honey, Florence no doubt wired you about the red cross not doing anything from this end first, so honey talk to your chaplain. The baby is to be circumcised Saturday, maybe he'll do something for you. If you can't manage it for the Briss, then try to get time for the Pidyon-Aben², which comes due one month later. Papa, honey I know I don't have to tell you to do all you can because I am sure you will and good luck to you.

February 15, 1944

Honey,

My sister Sarah brought me your letters #115, 116 today. Your mother was here today too. She and Sarah went to see the baby. They saw him through the glass of the nursery. He's getting sweeter every day. Your mom said he looks just like you did when you were a baby. I've been trying to determine who he looks like and couldn't, but your mother knows how you looked when you were small so that's it. Oh honey, I wanted to tell you, as I was going to the hospital the mail came and I received an announcement that Marilyn Leach had a baby boy born Feb 5th, his name is Ronald Jacob. I'm going to write her.

Honey our little one is quite an important fellow. We're making the arrangements for the Briss. My brother Moe printed cards. Ann's mother baked cookies. Sophie's mother is baking

honey cake. Sarah is making Mondel cake. Your mother is making strudel and I'll be buying the whiskey and of course will take care of whatever expense it will entail.

How are you honey. How are you making out with the furlough dear. I wish you have success. Honey if it will help you to have bought the bond, then of course I'm happy about it.

Now my darling I'm hoping that our baby's Daddy will be able to be present at one or both of his parties. It would be wonderful, so good luck dear.

I'll close now. You understand I'm writing these letters while lying in bed ... and a pencil is all I have so excuse how it looks dear.
